

INFORMATION, RULES AND GUIDELINES: May 3 & 4, 2025 GT CATCH & RELEASE

- A) MINIMUM SIZE REQUIREMENTS: Each entering Giant Trevally (GT) will be classified according to length individually. Minimum Length: 21 inches
- B) TEAM MEMBERS PER BOAT: Maximum number of persons per team is 5 including the captain.
- C) TEAM BRIEFING: All teams must attend TEAM BRIEFING at Drop Off Bar & Grill on Thursday, May 1, 2025 at 5:00
- D) ENTRY FEE: Registration is \$100 ending at the end of Team Briefing on May 1, 2025. Registration thereafter, is \$125. Maximum number of people on a team is 5 (five) including the captain. Additional member thereafter is \$10 each. Please make check payable to PSFA (Palau Sport Fishing Association).
- E) RELEASE OF LIABILITY: To be eligible, everyone must sign the registration/liability form, provided by PSFA.
- F) TOURNAMENT DAY & FISHING HOURS: Saturday, May 3, 2025 - 5:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. and Sunday, May 4, 2025 at 5:00am - 4:00pm.
- G) FLAGS: All boats must check-in at Drop-Off Bar & Grill for inspection and obtain a flag before departure that morning. At the end of the day, all boats are required to check-out and return flags. A \$5 deposit is required at the time of registration for lost or unreturned flags. Any un-returned flag (i.e. failure to check in) at the end of the day of the tournament before 6pm will be disqualified from the tournament and/or disqualified from participating in future PSFA tournaments. The \$5 deposit will be reimbursed upon the return of the flag by 6pm on Sunday, May 4, 2025.
- serve all boat safety regulations.

I) PROHIBITED GEARS for all Participants:

- Electric Reels, trolling gear
- Barbed Hooks, Wire Lines/leaders,
- Leaders exceeding 40 ft
- Gaffs, Firearms
- Maximum 150 lbs leader
- J) CONSERVATION PRACTICES: Required On-board Gear
 - Bilge pump or empty cooler for sea water
 - Carpet/towel
 - Barbless hooks
 - Ruler, camera

- K) OBSERVANCE OF NATIONAL, STATE AND TRADI-TIONAL LAWS All participants must observe all national and state conservation laws, and must stay away from "no fishing zones" which include the following closed areas:
 - Ngemelis -Half mile from reef in observance of the traditional bul
 - Ngerukeuid Islands Wildlife Preserve
 - Ngerumekaol
 - Ebiil Channel Conservation Area, and other channels between Ngerchelong and Kayangel states
 - One mile radius around Ngaruangel Atoll reef edge.
- L) FISH QUALITY/PROHIBITIONS: All fish must be properly handled, with towels or in a cooler with sea water.
- M) OFFICIAL LENGTH: To be official, fish length must be certified by the authorized PSFA Tournament Weight Master.
- N) MATCHING OPPOSED LENGTH: In the event that two opposing fish are the same, the first fish photo recorded will be declared the winner. The second fish recorded will take next place automatically.
- O) FINAL DECISIONS: All decisions of the tournament director will be final. The Tournament Director for the event is Jennifer Gibbons. Weigh Master is Clayton Johanes
- P) AWARDING OF PRIZES: Awards Ceremony to be held 6:00 p.m. on Monday, May 5, 2025 at Drop Off Bar & Grill. Recipients are encouraged to bring families, friends, and ready their cameras to record the event.
- **O) MULTIPLE TOURNAMENT PARTICIPATION:**

Each team may participate in multiple tournaments. However, H) BOAT SAFETY REGULATIONS: All participants must ob- one tournament per day and fees must be paid in full for each tournament separately.
